2. Resolution No. R-13-36 – A Resolution to award a contract to Muller Construction for the demolition of five properties.

■ Fire Chief James Grimmett stated bids were opened for the demolition of five structures with Muller Construction having the low bid at \$15,450.

3. Resolution No. R-13-37 – A Resolution to award a construction contract to T. C. Underground for a water main replacement.

■ Deputy Public Works Director Jim Bradshaw stated the City has two water mains supplying water to the Industrial Park. Over the past several months, there have been at least 12 major main leaks on the 12" supply line and it currently has at least two leaks now. With the average cost of repair clamps being \$800 to \$1,200, staff recommends this line be replaced to insure a reliable feed to the Industrial Park. Quotes were received from two contractors with the low quote from T. C. Underground for \$80,274.50.

4. Report on drought status.

■ Public Works Director Chuck Shively stated the City received notice from the Kansas Department of Agriculture Division of Water Resources the order prohibiting diversion of water from the Verdigris River had been lifted due to adequate natural flows now in the river. As a result, the water warning has been lifted for Coffeyville water customers, and a water watch put in place.

5. Comments from Commissioners and Staff

■ Finance Director Stephanie Richardson reported the City is preparing to send out requests for qualifications for financial advisors. The City currently has electric utility bonds which are eligible for refunding. Following discussion it was determined to wait to do the bond refunding until the financial advisor is in place.

■ City Manager Gary Bradley reported ETC will make a report on the survey results at the next meeting. Sonoco, who is currently leasing a portion of the old Walmart building has expressed an interest in leasing the entire building or purchasing it; Commissioners concurred the City should enter into negotiations with them.

■ Commissioner Kastler suggested the city declare June as Coffeyville History Month.

■ Commissioner Williams requested the agreement between the Coffeyville Gun Club and the City of Coffeyville be updated; he requested an additional time for public comments be added to the end of the meeting.
