G. COMMENTS FROM THE PUBLIC

The public is free to comment on items not listed on the agenda. Public participation is welcome and encouraged for all items on the agenda as the topics are discussed.

1. Comments from Coffeyville Municipal Band

- Tiffany Horsley provided information on the history of the band, the current status of inventory and the band's budget. She requested the City increase the annual payment from \$4,000 to \$6,000, review the budget every three years, add their schedule to Channel 13 and City website, provide a permanent location for equipment storage during the off season and discuss the possibility of a permanent concert location.

- Vickie Cease, 501 S. Ohio, requested the City not enforce the sign ordinance pertaining to placing business signs in the right of way.
- Fire Chief James Grimmert reported their will be a large display board located in the parking lot across the street from the Shrine Barn for the posting of signs.
- Mary Wilson, 207 West New, reported on the Farmers' Market.
- Wayne Scott, 705 Willow, suggested there be a ballot initiative to determine the opinion of the citizens on banning dogs.
- Ivan Smith, 1269A CR 5300, questioned the appearance of the flower bed at the Brown Mansion, and held a discussion with Commissioner Edwards about the appearance of the rental properties he owns.
- Diane Smith, 2899 CR 4350, expressed concern about how her nephew, who is a quadriplegic, is going to be able to fix his house.
- Sheriff Bobby Dierks reported his plan is to keep the Sheriff's Office in Coffeyville open as long as the court is there.
- Commissioner Edwards expressed concern over the County Commissioners plan to close the Sheriff's office stating 56% of the assessed valuation for the county comes from the southeast corner.
- Sharon Yeubanks, 2268 CR 4300, commented on issues with the Code Enforcement officer making it difficult for Ivan Smith and his wife to have time to fix up their property.

I. NEW BUSINESS

1. Discussion and action to appoint one person to the Juvenile Community Corrections Board.
Applicant: Winifred Flowers

- City Clerk Cindy Price stated the City of Coffeyville makes three appointments to this Board which is organized under state statute. The only applicant is Winifred Flowers who is completing her second three-year term making her technically ineligible according to City policy. The Commission may suspend the rules and reappoint her to an additional term.

- Chris Felix reported Coffeyville Connections is currently able to cover approximately 80% of the city.
- Cindy Price reported on the 4th of July activities planned and Clean-Up Day scheduled for August 3. Approval was also given to waive garage sale fees for the 100 mile sale on September 13-14.
- Mayor George stated he is hearing positive comments about the streets.
- Commissioner Williams praised the Coffeyville Recreation Commission for the work done on the basketball courts at LeClere Park.
