CITY OF COFFEYVILLE PARK RULES & REGULATIONS

- 1. All city parks shall be open daily to the public during the hours of 6 a.m. and 12 a.m. It shall be unlawful for any person or persons, other than city personnel conducting city business therein, or other authorized persons, to occupy or be present in any city parks during any hours in which the park is not open to the public except for authorized functions approved in by the city manager.
- 2. Any individuals or organizations using park facilities for events advertised to or attended by the public shall provide proof of liability insurance in the amount of \$500,000 covering each day of the event. The insurance shall be obtained from an insurance company authorized to do business in the State of Kansas. The city shall be named as an additional insured on the policy and the policy shall require the city be given ten days' written notice of cancellation.
- 3. No person shall discharge firearms in the parks.
- 4. Maximum speed limit is 20 miles per hour.

LECLERE PARK LAKE

Fishing

- 1. Fishing is permitted in LeClere Lake and must conform to the state fish and game laws. A fishing license is required if required by law.
- 2. Trout season November 1 April 15. A State of Kansas trout permit is required for ages 16 and above whether fishing for trout or not.
- 3. No trot lines, limb lines, bank lines or ice fishing will be permitted.
- 4. No catfish less than 15 inches or bass less than 18 inches may be removed from LeClere Lake.
- 5. Daily creel limit
 - Bass − 2 per person per day
 - Catfish 5 per person per day
 - Crappie 50 per person per day
 - Sunfish and bluegill no limit
 - Wiper 5 per person per day
 - Trout 5 per person per day

Watercraft allowed

- 1. Canoes 18 feet or less in length
- 2. Rowboats and sailboats 12 feet or less in length.
- 3. Electric trolling motors.
- 4. Persons using watercraft are required to wear Coast Guard approved life jackets.

Swimming

1. No swimming or ice skating permitted.
